### Guideline for the Prescribing of Emollients

It is acknowledged that the best choice of emollient is the one which the patient will use both frequently and liberally. The guideline aims to support a wide choice, whilst minimising duplication of ingredients and excipients, and ensuring least expensive options are prioritised. For this reason, products within each category

### Emollient Prescribing Guideline for Primary and Secondary ...

□ Emollient is defined as a substance that is designed to occlude the skin surface and to encourage build-up of water within the stratum corneum □ Generally the greasier the emollient the more effective it is. □ All emollients should be applied frequently – at least twice a day.

### Emollient Prescribing Guidelines Formulary

QUANTITIES OF EMOLLIENT PRESCRIBING IN ADULTS A trial of cost-effective emollients suitable for the patient should be prescribed in small packs initially for the patient to decide which is the most suitable for them. A larger quantity then can be considered after this point. For emollient, general rule is 600g per week.

### Emollient Prescribing Guideline

□ Existing patients prescribed a non-formulary emollient for a diagnosed skin condition should be reviewed with a view to trialling a preferred formulary emollient after discussion with the patient. □ Where prescribing is appropriate, prescribers should select the formulary option with the lowest acquisition cost wherever possible depending on severity of symptoms, patient preference and site of application.

### Skin - Wiltshire CCG Medicines Management

• Initially, prescribe a small amount of emollient on an acute prescription to gauge suitability to patient. Once a suitable emollient is found, prescribe a sufficient amount (see Table 1) as a variable-use repeat prescription. •Preferred Emollients: see table 2

### Emollient prescribing for psoriasis: Information for ...

In DS&E, this study suggests that, rather than reserving Aveeno as a second or third-line therapy, prescribing Aveeno first-line may save NHS primary care costs. In a recent UK study of emollient therapy for eczema in children, four different emollients, including Aveeno, were evaluated [ 20 ].

### Emollient Guideline and Formulary

Groins and genitalia 15-25g 60-100g 100ml 400ml. Generally the greasier the emollient the more effective it is as more moisture is retained in the skin but may be less. acceptable or tolerated. Ointments do not contain any preservatives so suitable for sensitivities but do not use if infection is present.

### Emollient Prescribing Guidelines

Guidance notes for choosing the correct emollient for your patient Emollient choice for dry skin Generally the greasier an emollient is the more effective it is. All should be applied frequently – at least twice per day. Lotions □ Needs reapplying frequently on very dry skin □ Good for very mild dry skin and also for the face
