If you plan to work with leather, you MUST have a rawhide mallet. Many leather tools require a mallet. Punching holes, stamping leather, setting snaps, the list is endless. A medium weight mallet is a great place to start (10-12 ounce).

Work the leather until it is fully soaked. You can do this by kneading and twisting it with your hands. Leave the item in the water for 10 minutes. Soaking will make the leather more pliable. Wear the leather while it's wet to stretch it out. The leather will stretch to fit your body perfectly.

Dip the sponge in to the dye and apply on the leather part doing a circular motion again try to apply evenly. Finish. Once the leather has completely dried with a damp rag gentle rub the leather this will remove excess ink that has not soaked in to the leather fully, After doing this you may need to apply a second coat of dye.

Step 1, Cut your leather into the desired shape. Before stamping your leather, cut it into the shape you want. For example, if you're making leather name tags, cut your leather into the shape of a name tag before stamping it. You can use a straight-edge rotary cutter or an x-acto knife to cut leather while it's lying on a flat surface. You should always cut

The hotter the water, the less time is needed; most craft leather will be thoroughly soaked in near-boiling water in less than 30 seconds.
